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815. ACCEPTABLE USE OF INTERNET, COMPUTERS, AND NETWORK RESOURCES

1. Purpose

NEW CASTLE AREA

SCHOOL DISTRICT

The Board of Directors of the New Castle Area School District supports the use of the computers, Internet and other network resources in the District's instructional and operational programs in order to facilitate learning, teaching, and daily operations through interpersonal communications and access to information, research, and collaboration.

The District provides students, staff, and other authorized individuals with access to the District's computers, electronic communication systems, and network, which includes Internet access, whether wired or wireless, or by any other means.

For instructional purposes, the use of network facilities shall be consistent with the curriculum adopted by the New Castle Area School District as well as the varied instructional needs, learning styles, abilities, and developmental levels of students.

2. Definitions

The term child pornography is defined under both federal and state law.

18 U.S.C. Sec. 2256

Child pornography – under federal law, is any visual depiction, including any photograph, film, video, picture, or computer or computer-generated image or picture, whether made or produced by electronic, mechanical, or other means, of sexually explicit conduct, where:

- 1. The production of such visual depiction involves the use of a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct;
- 2. Such visual depiction is a digital image, computer image, or computergenerated image that is, or is indistinguishable from, that of a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct; or
- 3. Such visual depiction has been created, adapted, or modified to appear that an identifiable minor is engaging in sexually explicit conduct.

Sec. 6312	Child pornography – under state law, is any book, magazine, pamphlet, slide, photograph, film, videotape, computer depiction, or other material depicting a child under the age of eighteen (18) years engaging in a prohibited sexual act or in the simulation of such act.
	The term harmful to minors is defined under both federal and state law.

Sec. 254	1. Taken as a whole, with respect to minors, appeals to a prurient interest in Nudity, sex, or excretion;
	2. Depicts, describes, or represents in a patently offensive way with respect to What is suitable for minors, an actual or simulated sexual act or sexual Contact, actual or simulated normal or perverted sexual acts, or lewd Exhibition of the genitals; and
	3. Taken as a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific Value as to minors.
18 Pa. C.S.A. Sec. 5903	Harmful to minors – under state law, is any depiction or representation in whatever form, of nudity, sexual conduct, sexual excitement, or sadomasochistic abuse when it:
	1. Predominantly appeals to the prurient, shameful, or morbid interest of Minors;
	2. Is patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult community as a whole With respect to what is suitable for minors; and
	3. Taken as a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, educational, or Scientific value for minors.
18 Pa. C.S.A.	Obscene – any material or performance, if:
Sec. 5903	1. The average person applying contemporary community standards would find that the subject matter taken as a whole appeals to the prurient interest;
	2. Is patently offensive to prevailing standards in the adult community as a Whole with respect to what is suitable for minors; and
	3. Taken as a whole lacks serious literary, artistic, political, educational, or scientific value for minors.

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	47 U.S.C. Sec. 254	Technology protection measure – a specific technology that blocks or filters Internet access to visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography, or harmful to minors.

Authority	The availability of access to electronic information available to students and staff does not imply endorsement by the District of the content, nor does the District guarantee the accuracy of information received. The District shall not be responsible for any information that may be lost, damaged, or unavailable when using the network or for any information that is retrieved via the Internet.
		The District shall not be responsible for any unauthorized charges or fees resulting from access to the Internet or other network resources.
	Pol. 218, 233, 317	The Board declares that computer and network use is a privilege, not a right. The District's computer and network resources are the property of the District. Users shall have no expectation of privacy in anything they create, store, send, receive, or display on or over the District's Internet, computers or network resources, including personal files or any use of the District's Internet, computers, or network resources. The District reserves the right to monitor, track, and log network access and use; monitor fileserver space utilization by District users; or deny access to prevent unauthorized, inappropriate, or illegal activity and may revoke access privileges and/or administer appropriate disciplinary action. The District shall cooperate to the extent legally required with the Internet Service Provider, local, state, and federal officials in any investigation concerning or related to the misuse of the District's Internet, computers, and network resources.

The District reserves the right to restrict access to any Internet sites or functions it deems in appropriate through established Board policy, or the use of software and/or online server blocking. Specifically, the District operates and enforces a technology protection measure(s) that blocks or filters access to in appropriate matter by minors on its computers used and accessible to adults and students. The technology

Sec. 254	protection measure shall be enforced during sue of computers with Internet access.
24 P.S. Sec. 4604	Upon request by students or staff, the Superintendent or designee shall expedite a review and may authorize the disabling of Internet blocking/filtering software to enable access to materials that is blocked through technology protection measures but is not prohibited by this policy.
3. Delegation of Responsibility	The District shall make every effort to ensure that this resource is used responsibly by students and staff.

Sec. 4604	The District shall inform staff, students, parents/guardians, and other users about this policy through employee and student handbooks, posting on the District web site, and by other appropriate methods. A copy of this policy shall be provided to parents/guardians, upon written request.
	Users of District networks or District-owned equipment shall, prior to being given access or being issued equipment, sign user agreements acknowledging awareness of the provisions of this policy and awareness that the District uses monitoring systems to monitor and detect inappropriate use and tracking systems to track and recover lost or stolen equipment.
	Student user agreements shall also be signed by a parent/guardian.
	Administrators, teachers, and staff have a professional responsibility to work together to help students develop the intellectual skills necessary to disc <i>ern</i> among information sources, to identify information appropriate to their age and developmental levels, and to evaluate and use the information to meet their educational goals.
	Students, staff, and other authorized individuals have the responsibility to respect and protect the rights of every other user in the District and on the Internet.
	The building administrator shall make initial determinations of whether inappropriate use has occurred.

Sec. 254 47 CFR	The Superintendent or designee shall be responsible for recommending technology and developing procedures to determine whether the District's computers are being used for purposes prohibited by law or for accessing sexually explicit materials. The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement administrative Sec. 254 regulations that ensure students are educated on network etiquette and other appropriate online behavior, including: 1. Interaction with other individuals on social networking web sites and in chat Rooms. SC 1301.1-A 2. Cyber bullying awareness and response. Pol. 249 4. Guidelines Network accounts shall be used only by the authorized owner of the account for its approved purpose. Network users shall respect the privacy of other users on the system. Safety It is the District's goal to protect users of the network from harassment and unwanted or unsolicited electronic communications. Any network user who receives threatening or unwelcome electronic communications or inadvertently visits or accesses an inappropriate site shall report such immediately to a teacher or administrator. Network users shall not reveal personal information to other users on the network, including chat rooms, e-mail, Internet, social networking web sites, etc. The School District, through the use of a firewall and related software, will filter Internet access pursuant to the Children's Internet Protection Act. The Filter may be disabled by the network administrator at the workstation level for use by an adult, administrator, or teacher for bona fide research or other lawful purposes. The Filter may not be disabled for use by students or other minors for any reason. Internet safety measures shall effectively address the following: 47 U.S.C. Sec. 254 1. Control of access by minors to inappropriate matter on the Internet. 47 CFR Sec. 54.520 2. Safety and security of minors when using electronic mail, chat rooms, and other forms of direct electronic communications.

- 3. Prevention of unauthorized online access by minors, including "hacking" and other unlawful activities.
- 4. Unauthorized disclosure, use, and dissemination of personal information regarding minors.

	5. Restriction of minors' access to materials harmful to them.
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	<u>Prohibitions</u>
	Users are expected to act in a responsible, ethical, and legal manner in accordance with District policy, accepted rules of network etiquette, and federal and state law. Specifically, the following uses are prohibited:
	1. Facilitating illegal activity.
	2. Commercial or for-profit purposes.
	3. Non-work or non-school related work.
	4. Product advertisement or political lobbying.

FOI. 249	6. Hate mail, discriminatory remarks, and offensive or inflammatory communication.
	7. Unauthorized or illegal installation, distribution, reproduction, or use of copyrighted materials.
Pol. 237	8. Accessing, sending, receiving, transferring, viewing, sharing, or downloading obscene, pornographic, lewd, or otherwise illegal materials, images, or photographs.
	9. Access by students and minors to material that is harmful to minors or is determined inappropriate for minors in accordance with Board policy.

	11. Transmission of material likely to be offensive or objectionable to recipients.
	12. Intentional obtaining or modifying of files, passwords, and data belonging to other users.
	13. Impersonation of another user, anonymity, and pseudonyms.
Pol. 814	14. Fraudulent copying, communications, or modification of materials in violation of copyright laws.
	15. Loading or using of unauthorized games, programs, files, or other electronic media.

- 16. Disruption of the work of other users.
- 17. Tampering with, willful destruction of, or theft of any computer equipment, whether it belongs to the school or to an individual. Tampering includes any deliberate effort to degrade or heal a system,, to tie up a system, or to compromise the system/network performance. Willful destruction includes any deliberate disabling or damaging or computer systems, peripheral equipment, such as scanners or printers, or other facilities or equipment including the network and any deliberate destruction or impairment of software or other users' files or data.
- 18. Accessing the Internet, District computers, or other network resources without authorization.
- 19. Disabling, or bypassing the Internet blocking/filtering software without authorization.
- 20. Accessing, sending, receiving, transferring, viewing, sharing, or downloading confidential information without authorization.
- 21. Quoting of personal communications in a public forum without the original author's prior consent.
- 22. The use of cameras in private places. A private place is one where a person may reasonably expect to be safe from unauthorized surveillance, such as locker rooms, restrooms, etc.
- 23. Geo-location or Geo Tagging services are prohibited on District property. Broadcasting your location or the location of others is not allowed. This supports privacy and security efforts within the District.

Security

System security is protected through the use of passwords. Failure to adequately protect or update passwords could result in unauthorized access to personal or District files. To protect the integrity of the system, the following guidelines shall be followed:

- 1. Employees and students shall not reveal their passwords to another individual.
- 2. Users are not to use a computer that has been logged in under another student's or employee's name.

Copyright 17 U.S.C. The illegal use of copyrighted materials is prohibited. Any data uploaded to or Sec. 101 et seq downloaded from the network shall be subject to fair use guidelines and applicable Pol. 814 laws and regulations. District Web-Site The District shall establish and maintain a web site and shall develop and modify its web pages to present information about the District under the direction of the Superintendent or designee. All users publishing content on the District web site shall comply with this and other applicable District policies. Users shall not copy or download information from the District web site and disseminate such information on unauthorized web pages without authorization from the building principal. Consequences For Inappropriate Use 24 P.S. The network user shall be responsible for damages to the equipment, systems, and Sec. 4604 software resulting from deliberate or willful acts. Illegal use of the network; intentional deletion or damage to files of data belonging to others; copyright violations; and theft of services will be reported to the appropriate legal authorities for possible prosecution. General rules for behavior and communications apply when using the Internet, in addition to the stipulations of this policy. Vandalism shall result in loss of access, disciplinary action, and/or legal proceedings. Vandalism is defined as any malicious attempt to harm or destroy data of another user, Internet or other networks; this includes but is not limited to uploading or creating computer viruses. Pol. 218, 233, Failure to comply with this policy or inappropriate use of the Internet, District 317 network, or computers shall result is usage restrictions, loss of access privileges, disciplinary action, and/or legal proceedings.
